



## Dan Dick's summary

“Vital churches are exciting, energizing, and enriching places. No one vital congregation in this study was doing everything perfectly, but they were making every effort to create God-focused, spiritually centered environments where every person, regardless of his or her location on the journey of faith could flourish, thrive, and grow.

## Dan Dick's summary

“Vital churches are about God first, community second, and the individual last. Faith is a verb, not a noun. Vital churches enable people to balance the inward spiritual focus with a missional, evangelical outward practice. Complacency, laziness, and procrastination have no place in the vital church, nor does representative ministry. Never do you find the ministry done by a few in the name of the many. Everyone in a vital church lives their ministry every day.

## Dan Dick's summary

“Accountability is paramount in the vital church. Making sure what we say and what we do align perfectly is a high priority of the vital congregation. Vital churches are grounded in values, deep passions, and the relentless pursuit of God's will and vision for the faith community. Integrity is the best word to describe the vital church.

## Dan Dick's summary

“Many people find the description of the vital church compelling, but unrealistic. ‘It sounds great,’ one pastor told me, ‘but it would take a hundred years of non-stop work to get there. I can just hear what some people will say if we say we’re going to hold them accountable or expect them to start doing certain things.’ Leaders in pursuit of vitality are not seeking it because it is easy, but because it is good and right.

## Dan Dick's summary

“ ‘It is hard work—the hardest you will ever do—but where did we get the idea that church was supposed to be easy? We are talking about the meaning of life, eternal life, and a relationship with God, for crying out loud,’ a lay leader explained, ‘this should be easy?’

## Dan Dick's summary

“ ‘People will put into it what they think its worth,’ offered a small group leader and spiritual mentor. ‘I think there are a lot of people who are starving for a whole different kind of life, a life with meaning, a *faith* with meaning. Sure, lots of people don’t want what we have here, but you know what? A lot do. We are a church for those who really, really serious about their faith. Too many people approach their faith as amateurs; we’re professionals.’

## Dan Dick's summary

“Church isn’t something a person can plug into an already full and otherwise demanding life. For participants in vital churches, church and life cannot be separated, and faith is never compartmentalized. The people are the church—every minute of every day. The body of Christ is incarnate, fulfilling the will of God as a faithful steward of all God’s creation.”
